

## **Calling from rounds to Tittums**

## **Purpose**

A commonly rung call change where the small and larger bells are interleaved in ascending numerical order – 1 4 2 5 3 6 or 1 5 2 6 3 7 4 8. It is often thought of as a particularly pleasing call change, and composers of methods sometimes strive to include rows of Tittums near the end of a course for musicality.

The name Tittums is onomatopoeic, with the alternating high and low notes sounding like 'tum-ti-tum-ti-tum'.
